Suwito stated that "akhlaq" is also known as the science of behavior or conduct, as it helps us understand the virtues of the soul and how to purify impure souls. Character reflects values seen in behavior that demonstrates goodness, positive actions, and positive impacts on the environment, formed through thoughts, feelings, physical actions, and the beliefs of individuals or groups.

#### Methods of Character Education

Character education should start from the basic principles of human nature, referred to as "fitrah." Every individual is born with their own "fitrah," including intellect, desires (body), heart, and spirit. Islamic religious education aims to improve society's development, both as individuals and as members of society. Islam views education as a crucial element in humanizing people. Children are born with innate purity and potential that can be developed, and if they are raised in an environment rich in Islamic guidance, they will internalize the Islamic way of life and norms. Conversely, the lack of such guidance can lead to opposite outcomes.

There are several methods of character education that can be used to achieve these goals, including:

- 1) **Exemplary Method:** Using positive examples through words and actions to guide students, a method successfully used by the Prophet in his mission.
- 2) **Habituation Method:** Instilling good habits in behavior, skills, abilities, and thought patterns consistently. Once habits are established, they are easier to execute.
- 3) **Advice Method:** Providing explanations of truth and benefits to avoid harm and direct individuals toward happiness and benefits. Stories from the Quran and the life of the Prophet are often used to illustrate the values taught.

- 4) **Motivation and Intimidation Method:** Using motivation through the promise of happiness and love, and "tarhib" as a warning against wrongdoing. The use of persuasive language is critical in this method.
- 5) **Persuasion Method:** Convincing students of the teachings using logic and reason, encouraging them to use their intellect to distinguish right from wrong.
- 6) **Storytelling Method:** Using stories from the past to teach moral values. These stories can raise awareness, inspire, and impart the desired values to students.

Each method has its own advantages and approach to shaping students' character and personality. In the context of Islamic education, the application of these methods can enhance the understanding and practice of Islamic teachings in a comprehensive and planned manner.

#### The Impact of Character Education in Islamic Religious Education
